- 1976-1981 - Rev. Mel and Lorna Tucker became our new pastors. The church grew rapidly. The last wedding he performed in our church was for Colin and Glenda Leavett-Brown in August of 1981.

- 1982 – Colin and Lorna Lewry, Salvation Army officers living in Esquimalt but unassigned at that time, supplied the Esquimalt Church of the Nazarene pulpit for a year after the Tuckers left.

- August 1983 – 1990 – Rev. Leonard and Dot Hemphill, with their young family, served as our pastors until they moved to Alberta.

- 1991 – Robin and Jackie Richardson served as pastors.

- 1992 – John and Doreen Greenwood came to be our pastors at a time when the church was once again in danger of having to close its doors. In 1994, John became ill and was not able to continue so Doreen stepped into the role as pastor until 1998.

- 1995-2003 – Safe Harbour Christian School, under the principalship of Mrs. Lorraine Thompson, opened its doors and held classes in the basement of the church. In 2003, the school moved to the old parsonage building at High Point Salvation Army church in Vic West where it continued until the school's closure in 2006.

- 1998 – to the present – Rev. Barry and Janette Goodwin and family moved from Calgary to pastor the Esquimalt Church of the Nazarene.

- 2003 - Pastor Barry Gill (Associate Pastor) with his wife Barbara joined the church in 2003

- 2004 – Pastor Barry, with the help of Pastor Larry Gill, led the renovation and upgrading of the church building. A Work and Witness team from California came to re-roof the church and also prepare the kitchen for its upgrade.

- 2008 - Pastor Gill and his wife resigned from the church in 2008 to help plant a new church in the city.

- 2009 - Jong Chae (Abraham) Woo and his wife Sunwoo Park (Suzanna) joined the church in 2009. They are in Canada preparing to become missionaries to North Korea. Abraham took on the position of Associate Pastor with a direct focus on Korean youth
